Local festivals, traditional events and similar aspects of folk culture, many already struggling to deal with a shortage of young successors to keep them going, have come **1** additional strain as the novel coronavirus has forced many such events to be canceled. To help, the Agency for Cultural Affairs* has decided to provide large-scale support totaling ¥6.5 billion in a supplementary budget for fiscal 2021. The public and private sectors will have to work together quickly to overcome the crisis.

Oga's Namahage is a traditional New Year's Eve event in the Daishima area of Oga, Akita Prefecture. "Are there any crybabies here?" At the end of last year, for the first time in two years, a Namahage's roar echoed through a neighborhood as it made its rounds of residents' houses. The Namahage monsters — actually actors in carved wooden masks — playfully "threatened" local children as they have in generations past. One difference was that the adults in the households they visited refrained **2** placating* the monsters with the customary alcoholic beverages, as a pandemic precaution. Two-thirds of the neighborhood associations in Oga canceled their events at the end of 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic, but a number of the groups decided to resume them at the end of 2021. A chairman of a preservation group explained the reason for the resumption, saying, "We can't let the tradition die out as we struggle with fewer young people and a shortage of persons willing to take on a role."

Over the past two years or so, the pandemic has caused the cancellation of **3** festivals, including the Yamahoko Float Procession of the Gion Festival* held in Kyoto in the summer. According to the agency, of the 327 events designated as national important intangible folk cultural properties, including Oga's Namahage, about 250 were canceled in fiscal 2020 and "about the same number" of events had to be canceled or changed in fiscal 2021. This year, the float procession of the Kyoto festival will be held for the first time in three years. The Hachinohe Enburi Festival was scheduled to be held in Hachinohe, Aomori Prefecture, from February 17 to 20, but due to the spread of the omicron variant of the virus, the festival was canceled for the second year in a row. Instead, the preservation group broadcast a video recorded to promote the festival on the Internet.

In December 2020, the Tokyo National Research Institute for Cultural Properties reported on the impact of the pandemic on intangible folk cultural properties, noting that, in addition to concerns about the handing down of skills due to a lack of training, the disuse of mikoshi portable shrines — usually carried in boisterous fashion by large groups of people — would lead to reduced necessity to repair them. Some expressed concern that this would mean fewer jobs for craftspeople, potentially setting off a vicious cycle* of decline. The head of the institute's Intangible Folk Cultural Properties Section fears that "the absence of folk events will lead to the loss of faith and entertainment long nurtured in the community, and ultimately to loss of the community's uniqueness."

This supplementary budget is an exceptional measure of support in **4** it applied to folk cultural properties whether or not they are designated by the national government. However, the budget for each project is capped* at ¥35 million for designated ones, compared **5** ¥15 million for undesignated ones. The funds are to be used for the repair of floats, costumes and other equipment. Following the approval

of the supplementary budget in December last year, the agency solicited* applications from keepers of folk cultural properties through local governments by February this year. On April 1, it was decided that support would be given in a total of 514 cases, including nationally designated properties.

Unable to give their usual performances in each area, preservation groups are increasingly making videos to show online. The agency, in consultation with the keepers of the traditions, also supports the use of digital technology and other means to promote such efforts. Local governments are also beginning to provide their own support. The Nanto city government in Toyama Prefecture has decided to support the holding of three festivals which had been canceled or curtailed for two consecutive years until last year. The organizers of the festivals will receive subsidies for 80% of expenses up to ¥500,000 to hold the festivals, on the condition that they take anti-infection measures. The fund was expected to be used for “Three Cs*” measures and the purchase of masks.
